



2. What are Local Place Plans?

Local Place Plans are community-led plans setting out proposals for the development and use of land.

Once completed and then registered by the planning authority, they are to be taken into account in the preparation of the relevant local development plan.

3. Who prepares the Local Place Plan?

Definition of a Community Body

- (a) a community-controlled body within the definition given in section 19 of the Community Empowerment (Scotland) Act 2015, or
- (b) a community council established in accordance with Part 4 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973

4. Why prepare a Local Place Plan?

- Represent the communities views in a formal and united way
- Put forward proposals for land use to be considered for the next Local Development Plan. (Proactively, and unlike how things were done before).
- Highlight issues that are specific to your area, and suggest ways they can be tackled
- Take a pro-active role in the plan for your place


